## PROPOSED CHANGES TO YOUR RATES ACCOUNT 1879034200 23 Main Road, Hector

#### Proposed change

Council is considering changing the way drinking water targeted rates are charged as part of the Annual Plan 2024/2025, so that the rates are consistently applied across the district, and so the policy is more closely aligned with the methods for charging targeted rates as set out in the Local Government (Rating) Act 2002.

The proposed change will mean that all rating units that are not connected but are able to be connected to the water supply ("serviceable") are charged for availability of supply. This means if a connection could be made to the water supply because it is within 50 metres of the water reticulation system, a charge will apply. The charge is 50% of a targeted fixed water rate. This change will align the rates application for all water supplies in the district. Currently for some water supplies, half rates for availability of connection are charged, whereas other supplies are not.

The Serviceable rate will apply for each "Separately Used or Inhabited Part of a rating unit" (SUIP).

You may also receive a similar letter relating to wastewater as Council has a separate proposed list of changes for drinking water and wastewater.

#### How has this proposed change been determined?

Council has used data provided from Quotable Value (QV) our independent valuers to inform the application of the policy, alongside merged data from both the Geographic Information System (GIS or WestMaps) and the Rating Information Database.

Council has reviewed the location of your property and determined it to be within 50 metres of the water reticulation system and therefore subject to the proposed Serviceable rate.

What is also critical is that BDC takes action to protect ecologically significant Stewardship land Te Kuha and 100+ ha of the Westport Water Conservation Reserve in order to protect the towns drinking water supply from a proposed huge new open cast mine Te Kuha. (Stevenson MIning has been pushing for a coal mine in this inappropriate location for many years but although they has lost in every instance in the Courts they now hope to progress their plans via the Fast Track process.) BDC needs to protect the existing water infrastructure and protect the quality of the towns drinking water supply (which would be put at risk from acid mining drainage if a new coal mine went ahead Te Kuha and in the Westport Water Conservation Reserve).

This is a matter of urgency (council action) given the current (Coalition) governments controversial Fast Track Proposals Bill and evidence of Minister Shane Jones clandestine meetings with mining industry representatives from Stevenson Mining, which he failed to log in his Ministerial Diary.

BDC action is required In order to protect the drinking water supply for the town (protecting the Westport Water Conservation Reserve and Te Kuha will also have other significant benefits including for indigenous biodiversity and recreation).

The Westport Water Conservation Reserve was set aside in perpetuity by council back in the day to protect the drinking supply of the town. If Stevenson Mining was allowed to proceed with a huge new open cast coal mine on Te Kuha and in the Westport Water Conservation Reserve there would be unacceptable levels of environmental degradation and adverse impacts on drinking water quality.

Stevenson MIning recently (late February 2024) pulled its latest appeal in the Courts, immediately after the clandestine meeting on 19 February 2024 with Minister for Regional Development Shane Jones. It is extremely likely that Stevenson Mining has lodged a formal application to the Fast Track process for a new open cast coal mine on Te Kuha and in the Westport Water Conservation Reserve. Our members love walking and tramping in the bush above Westport and we and many others would like this pristine area protected, for the well being of Westport and wider Buller residents

and ratepayers, to protect critically endangered native species, and an outstanding landscape above the Lower Buller Scenic Gorge.

We oppose Stevenson Mining who continues to try to impose a huge new open cast coal mine on ecologically significant public conservation land and 100+ ha of the Westport Water Conservation Reserve (home to many critically endangered native species). see Federated Mountain Clubs December 2017 media release https://fmc.org.nz/2017/12/10/federated-mountain-clubs-savs-no-to-te-kuha-mine/

We ask BDC to prioritize truly sustainable integrated management and do all that it can to help ameliorate climate change. This is necessary to protect your ratepayers and residents, indigenous biodiversity and the wider environment.

We thank council for its submission to the controversial Fast Track Proposals Bill and urge you to do everything in your power to oppose a new open cast coal mine on ecologically significant public conservation land/ Stewardship land Te Kuha and the Westport Water Conservation Reserve. The Fast Track proposals Bill contains wording that indicates the nefarious intention of the Coalition government to block public participation and basic democratic processes, so we are all the more reliant upon council vigilance.

We also support the protection of Noteable trees in the District (native and otherwise). Our vision is a vibrant and healthy Buller District, with strong environmental protections in place, in order to protect not only finite resources like soils and waterways (which underpin all primary production) but farmers and rural ratepayers and their valuable enterprises. I was shocked to receive recent correspondence from Council advising me of significant increases for my business in Water and Wastewater Rates. My total rates will increase in the region of 55% and this does not include any increase to the general rate and increases in metered water rate charges.

Everybody understands that nationwide there are major issues surrounding water infrastructure and it has to be funded somehow. On first reading however one can't help but think that an easy fix has been proposed to gather a significant amount of rates funding from a relatively small group of ratepayers in one huge hit with potentially more to come.

It is not enough to say that these increases are making up for historic under-charging. That is not the fault of the ratepayers. There is a significant amount of information in the correspondence to take in, let alone try to understand and do research, and a very short amount of time in which to do so. I am aware of some ratepayers who have only received the information in the last few days, either because they have been away or because there was a delay in the information reaching them.

The very short consultation period from receipt of the notices to the deadline is simply not enough. Time is needed to seek further information and also advice from industry organizations, in my case Hospitality New Zealand, as to how other Councils are handling what amounts to a 'Pan Tax' by another name.

Water Rates

I already pay metered water rates based on the actual usage of the property and this is fair. I fail to understand why there would be two connection charges when the usage I am paying for covers all buildings on the property. Waste Water

The calculation of waste water rating units fails to take in to consideration the fact that commercial accommodation units are not occupied 24/7. The average guest is in their unit for a few hours, most of which is time is spent sleeping, and we certainly do not enjoy anywhere near 100% occupancy. Therefore wastewater coming from the property per guest unit is likely to be far less than an average household.

## Submission to Annual Plan 16/5/24 Chris Reynolds

There are many parts of this Annual Plan that I object to.

- 1. If you continue to escalate rates as has happened over the last ten or more years you will have no businesses remaining. Council's rates and other compliance charges and incompetence have caused insurance costs to skyrocket. Businesses will not be able to survive. The ratepayers of Westport cannot afford any further rates rise.
- 2. On the subject of rubbish I believe it should be charged on a user pays basis.
- 3. The Karamea Highway is a state highway and must stay one and should be funded by Government.
- 4. Trade Waste. I have advised the Council on this subject on several occasions already. This was incorrectly set up and is being charge illegally. Even if this had been legitimately set up, businesses have been put into categories that do not even apply to them which also makes the charges invalid. This has just been yet another attempt to extract money from businesses. Sort it out.
- 5. Staff benefits. \$2m for 70 staff equals \$28k each. This is totally unaffordable especially when you already have the highest wages of any Council on the Coast. It seems a lot of Council staff cannot even do their jobs and we have to get consultants to do their jobs for them. Pay cuts would be more appropriate.
- 6. Compliance costs. When we were forced to earthquake strengthen our building (which most of the town have not done, including Council), extra compliance costs were applied. We pay Westland Fire \$500+ to do fire alarm checks and then the Council has charged us \$150 to file this paperwork. This fee has now increased to \$397. This is an outrageous increase and has been justified by claiming that an audit was the reason for this. We have not seen the results of an audit and now this cost has become just a fee. Your compliance person (who clearly was unfamiliar with fire alarms) took 6 minutes for the charge of \$397. These are the kinds of ridiculous costs that are crippling businesses.
- 7. Water rate. Water rate for businesses and houses with two businesses on a property going from 1.7 to 2 charges. The rates bylaw states 1 connection, 1 charge. Most businesses would use minimal water compared to a house and already pay higher commercial rates. This is yet another rate grab. I object strenuously to this.
- 8. Toilet tax. What a ridiculous idea and just yet another avenue to collect more money unfairly.
- 9. The billboards on the highways to Westport. These billboards were paid for out of the tourism budget which was charged to businesses. They were put up to advertise Buller and it's attractions to bring tourists into Westport. It appears you are renting them out and allowing them to promote places in Christchurch. This was never the intended purpose. These were paid for by local businesses to promote our area. They must be used for Buller.
- 10. Rating consistency. Last year my rates increased by 31.5% which was not what was quoted. Several years ago it was 53.4% over 2 years. I wrote to all Councillors and

the Mayor at the time and got no response from anyone. I was later advised that the increases were necessary to take up the shortfall arising from the closure of Holcim. Ratepayers are not a never ending supply of money and these kinds of actions show the lack of respect that the Council has for its ratepayers. At a time when costs are already so high and a massive power price hike is looming, it is imperative for the survival of the town to ensure we have no rate rise. At no time should a rate rise ever increase beyond the rate of inflation. Council needs to cut its costs instead of expecting the ratepayers to pay for Councils extravagances.

- 11. Timing of release of consultation document. The public expect that a consultation document will be released in plenty of time for them to digest the information and have time to have their say. It is not acceptable to have documentation only being received after the consultation meeting as the rubbish bag pricing.
- 12. The Hub. This is just another example of wasteful spending. These services already exist and there is no need to spend money just to rehouse them under one roof.
- 13. Forensic audit release. As highlighted in the Westport News by many letters to the Editor, the town is very unhappy about this audit not being released. We are now told we will be allowed to see a sanitised version which we will undoubtedly have to pay extra for. The people of Westport expect our Council to be honest and transparent and this is not happening. Instead we get more cover ups.

Sadly, trust in our Council is at an all time low. Council must cut its spending rather than expecting ratepayers to continue to pay extra. Council is taking money from people who can't afford it and in lots of instances giving it to organisations who should be funding themselves. Eg sports, arts etc. This cannot continue. It's time they learnt to focus on 'needs' not 'wants'.

#### 1. Roading - What to do if Waka Kotahi - New Zealand Transport Agency does not fund as much as Council applied for?

When preparing this enhanced annual plan, Council submitted a programme of works to Waka Kotahi NZTA for inclusion in the National Land Transport. Programme (NLTP), Waka Kotahi NZTA will release indicative allocations for the NLTP in late May 2024. The final budget allocations are expected in August. This is partly due to changes within the new government's Policy Statement for land transport.

The key issue is whether Waka Kotahi NZTA will either agree with and support Council's proposed program of works and budget accordingly or indicate a revised approved budget allocation. Any change is unlikely to exceed what Council requested, but it may be less. Council has three options if Waka Kotahi NZTA approves a lower budget allocation.

#### Submission to Annual Plan 16/5/24 Lynda Reynolds

Any rate rise should never be greater than the rate of inflation. Some of us have had large rate rises now for many years, especially commercial rates. The people of Westport cannot afford more rises, especially with the rise in the cost of living and the anticipated skyrocket of power prices.

Work undertaken by the Council needs to be for core functions only and kept to minimal costs. The ratepayer can no longer afford to pay for 'feel good' projects and consultants fees. If Council staff are not capable of doing their own job then they shouldn't hold that position. 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Submission to the Enhanced Annual Plan for 2024 / 2025

The majority of ratepayers are financially stressed, lots cannot pay their rates at present let alone any further increase, ramifications will be severe. The time has come when you and the Government seriously face up to the fact Rate and Tax payers are already at the limits of their finances with no access to further income to meet increases.

I do not approve of the proposed rate increase.

Enhanced Annual Plan questions

**Roading** - What to do if Waka Kotahi - New Zealand Transport Agency does not fund as much as Council applied for?

Keep Council's level of funding as contained in the draft AP but reduce the overall programme to reflect Waka Kotahi's level of investment.

Policy on rates – How drinking water and wastewater rates are applied

Keep the policy the same on how water and wastewater targeted rates are charged.

**LGNZ** - Definitely cancel membership of LGNZ. - Westland, Grey and WCRC are correct in their summation that it has long since ceased to give any support needed by councils, in particular those of the West Coast. Other Mayors, chairs and lwi forum have gained good traction working with ministers, BDC remaining alone will achieve nothing except unnecessary expense added to rates.

## Westport Harbour

I note harbour activities of the port and dredging finances are ringfenced.

A significant assumption contained in the Plan is that a new large commercial operator would be <u>trialling</u> shipping out of the port from 2023-2024 and funding Westport Harbour.

Buller District Council have a history of setting unrealistic Port charges on the assumption that Corporate bodies will look favourably at keeping business at Westport. <u>Corporate businesses</u> <u>look at the bottom line and not the charitable aspect.</u> The Cement Wharfage rate was set at the start of the harbour contract in 1986 for operating the harbour under Buller Port Services. The contract specifically said that all Harbour rates were to be reviewed annually. The cement wharfage remained very much the same throughout.

Does the Westland Mineral Sands Port Management contract allow them to set their wharfage and port charges as did Buller Port Services? It is generally understood that WMS do not pay any charges until August 2024. In any case all product over the last two years has so far been trucked to and shipped out of Nelson. The chances are high that that may continue in the future in which case all assumptions on Westport Harbour finances are unrealistic. <u>Promises</u> continually given by the Managing Director Ray Mudgway over the last two years referencing ETA for the "Barge" have been proven imaginative to the point of raising dependance on them implausible. As of today, 20<sup>th</sup> May it has commenced its voyage to Nelson.

Until definite proof that the vessel's proposed operation is feasible any financial assumptions around WMS promised performance to Westport Harbour are very much in question.

What if the commercial operation does not proceed after the trialling? There is no consideration in this Annual Plan of how to manage the harbour. Income has already fallen below prediction of the Long Term Plan ring fenced or not, this debt will have to be funded at some time.

## <u>KAWATIRI</u>

Council uses the dredge for out- port dredging contracts which has provided some small net income in the past but shortfalls incurred in the future will have to be managed or Council should consider disposal of Kawatiri.

Future outport dredging options have very much decreased due to the Albatros of Dutch Dredging. Gisborne, which Kawatiri has previously done has just been completed by them last month. This leaves Nelson as the only possible viable annual contract for BDC. Like Westport further dredging by smaller ports relies on significant commercial income to fund it.

## KAWATIRI Significant Budget Capital Expenditure

Under LAGOIMA, I asked for documents to formulate this part of my submission which BDC Staff were timely in providing.

<u>\$818,000 for Kawatiri Dredge DOP pump installation and engine</u> <u>upgrades.</u>

I carefully examined the various budget papers provided for the council in support of this Budget request. This simple 'one liner' does not explain the project and neither did the papers. The project is neither accurately documented or costed with nothing to detail the Engine aspect and makes many unsound assumptions. The figure asked for is only **Estimated** so the true effect for you the Councillors or the ratepayer to consider is illusory, leading to an unsafe decision.

A DOP is a self contained pump with jet water arranged to be suspended and suitably manoeuvred to suck up detritus capable of being mobilised and removed, basically silt/sand. It needs either hydraulics or electric means from a power pack situated nearby. It discharges product via large diameter 250mm hose. A means of suspending is included in the proposal being a Chinese manufactured version of the generic "HIAB". Suspension is a complicated matter as can be seen in this accompanying photo with discharge, jet water and hydraulic pipes attached.



Compacted material such as Clay, stone or material contaminated with material such as rope, fishing net waste, wires, all present choke problems. The attached photo below from previous Kawatiri dredging operations in Nelson shows items encountered in the positions the DOP is proposed to operate.





The Hitachi crane rated at 30 ton used for Grab dredging was preemptively removed from the vessel without due consideration of consequences. Since then there has been no means to complete the whole Nelson dredging contract as required.

Should the future of the Nelson dredging contract rest on the ability to do those requirements of dredging the Fishing company berths then simply replacing the crane and grab, which was done in 2010 is a cheaper and fully known operation with satisfactory results.

The General Condition report on Kawatiri as at July 2023 needs to be kept in mind. Whilst the hull condition is reasonable most of the ancillary parts throughout are not. <u>Over capitalising Kawatiri as in</u> this DOP Budget item would be extremely unwise.

Bear in mind that WMS have stated that once their vessel arrives the concept is in a trial period. Whilst we all hope it goes well there are many great difficulties to overcome and work through and <u>no</u> <u>further expenditure of ratepayers money should be done in the</u> <u>immediate future.</u>

Dutch Dredging operates the dredge Albatros. They dredge all the larger ports under a joint port contract excepting Nelson which Kawatiri has held onto so far and Dunedin who have their own dredger New Era. Prior to last month Kawatiri had dredged Gisborne but that was done by Albatros last month.

Any financially viable outport dredging for BDC is extremely uncertain. If WMS see dredging as part of their needs then sell Kawatiri in its entirety to WMS.

We would like to see BDC have a stronger focus on truly sustainable integrated management, suppression or eradication of pest plants and feral pest animals in council reserves and parks, recycling (to reduce in the first instance the generation of rubbish), and protection of the Westport Water Conservation Reserve (the source of drinking water for the town).

#### **CLIMATE CHANGE**

We also support council doing everything in its power to protect Westport and local communities from climate change (given increasing extreme weather events, which can cause extreme flooding).

#### PERMANENT WALLS/ STOP BANK WESTPORT

We do not support the erection of permanent walls along the banks of the Kawatiri river, which in our view could exacerbate flooding in the town (putting residents at risk).

TE KUHA/ WESTPORT WATER CONSERVATION RESERVE

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A very important issue is the urgent need for further protection of ecologically significant public conservation land Te Kuha and the Westport Water Conservation Reserve from a new open cast coal mine (Auckland company Stevenson Mining/Rangatira Developments Ltd continues to advocate for a coal mine in this totally unsuitable location).

In the face of the biggest challenge of our time – climate change, it would be totally counter productive and inappropriate to allow a new coal mine in this specific location. Existing coal mines produce valuable steel and valuable employment, but are also known for the adverse environmental impacts they create (including but not limited to acid mine drainage). Examples of contaminated rivers and streams abound, including but not limited to the Ngakawau river. Coal is a great source of heat in the home, schools etc but burning coal does contribute to/ increases global climate disruption.

BDC should be mindful that although Stevenson Mining has repeatedly failed in the past to achieve its aim for a new coal mine in this particular location, under this new Coalition government there is a significant threat to Te Kuha and the Westport Water Conservation Reserve due to Stevenson Minings Fast track application.

Ministers in the past have repeatedly declined Stevensons application due to the major adverse impacts it would cause and the fact that the mine's potential economic benefits were not large enough to outweigh the irreparable damage to an area with very high, unique and nationally significant conservation values.

While we are grateful that a previous Westport council had the foresight (many years ago) to create the Westport Water Conservation Reserve, in order to protect the towns drinking water supply.

In the past (under then Mayor Gary Howard), BDC gave Stevenson Mining a resource consent for a coal mine in the Westport Water Conservation Reserve.

However, a subsequent Environment Court ruling should that BDC and WCRC's consents to allow mining of the Westport Water Conservation Reserve was illegal (the ruling was the outcome of Forest and Bird's legal challenge to the 2017 resource consent decision by commissioners for the BDC and WCRC to allow mining of the Westport Water Conservation Reserve.

The court ruling showed the importance of "environmental bottom lines".

It showed the council had violated the Reserves Act which required it to administer the land it holds for water supply purposes, "in a manner consistent with its purposes".

We ask that BDC learn from the mistakes of previous councils and now do the right thing by its ratepayers.

It is unacceptable to many of us that this outstanding scenic landscape, the many critically endangered native species, and the Water Conservation Reserve itself could be destroyed by the creation of a coal mine in this inappropriate location.

We remind council that Westports brand is WEST COAST UNTAMED NATURAL WILDERNESS. It is offensive for a company like Stevenson Mining to propose destroying such an Outstanding Landscape and the habitat of critically endangered rare native species (putting at risk the towns drinking water supply).

We would be deeply concerned if proposals that have already been declined by Government Ministers and halted by the judicial process were now allowed to go forward. This would sideline local communities, our interests, and ignore important environmental laws and protections. It is of particular concern that the Coalition government wishes to put unbridled power in the hands of 3 unqualified Ministers (with no participation from the Minister for the Environment), with one particular Minister (Shane Jones) shown to be completely biased, completely disinterested in the protection of critically endangered native species, and already severely compromised due to his secret meetings (including dinner with Barry Bragg of Stevenson Mining) with the mining industry.

In the case of Te Kuha, miners from our area chose not to mine the coal at this specific and accessible location directly above the town of Westport- for good reason. The proposed 150-hectare mine site includes 100+ hectares of the Westport Water Conservation Reserve (wisely set aside in perpetuity by the local council many years ago to protect the towns drinking water supply).

The controversial proposal by Stevenson Mining for a coal mine in this particular inappropriate location has been repeatedly rejected in the Courts (Environment Court, High Court, Supreme Court) and previous Ministers due to

- irreversible and permanent adverse impacts to the natural environment, outweighing any economic benefit

-destruction of critically endangered native species

-destruction of 100+ ha of the Westport Water Conservation Reserve and likely contamination of the town's water supply from a coal mine

The Te Kuha area is one of the last two areas of intact, elevated Brunner coal measure ecosystems. It is an undisturbed area which is precious and unique and supports complex and diverse habitats for threatened plants and wildlife including great spotted kiwi, land snails and lizards.

This valuable habitat for endangered native species nicely complements the Mount Rochfort Conservation Area.

By altering the existing topography and ridgeline the proposed mine would also affect the scenic values and landscapes of the Lower Buller Gorge.

The area has experienced very little human disturbance. Mining it would cause damage that is irreversible. The area has great potential for a walking/ tramping track, which would not only benefit locals but recreation in general (this would be excellent eco-tourism).

We ask that council budget funds to actively oppose Stevenson Mining's ill -advised plan for a coal mine on Te Kuha and in 100+ ha of the Westport Water Conservation Reserve.

# **Submission on Roading Programme**

✓ I prefer the option of reducing the roading programme to match the Waka Kotahi NZTA approved funding.

Next year when Council prepares the nine-year Long Term Plan the Waka Kotahi NZTA funding level will be clearly established and the affordability of the roading programme well understood. This certainty will enable staff and ratepayers to quantify the impact of external funding and make informed decisions and submissions.

# Submission on Water/Wastewater Targeted Rates

I am submitting in relation to the revised policy relating to multi-residential targeted rates for water supplies and wastewater schemes.

✓ I prefer the option of keeping these multi-residential targeted rates the same as 2023/24.

I am very concerned about the misinformation that has been distributed regarding this proposal in Council's Consultation Document, FAQ sheet and the article in the Westport News on Friday 17<sup>th</sup> May 2024, and question whether the consultation on the proposed changes to the multi-residential is technically valid.

Consultation material about the multi-residential targeted rates appears to based on two significant errors.

#### 1. Misconception regarding the 2023/24 Targeted Rate calculations

Below are extracts from the Buller District Council's 2023/24 Annual Plan Rates Funding Impact Statement, which is consistent with the adopted Rates Resolution for the financial year.

It is clear a factor of 1.0 applies to the water and sewage/wastewater multi-residential targeted rates for properties with either one or two connections/SUIP and it is only at three connections that a factor of 1.7 is applied.

In the newspaper article about multi-residential water rates last Friday, Council's CFO Douglas Marshall was mistaken in his statement that *the ratepayer in question was likely incorrectly billed and that under the Council's current multi-residential policy ratepayers are charged 70% of the targeted water rates for the second dwelling.* This response gives the impression that affected ratepayers are only facing a factor increase in their targeted rates of 0.3 rather than the actual 1.0 - which significantly downplays the level of change.

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Mayor Cleine's comment in the same article that the ratepayers facing the factor increase of 1.0 were lucky because they have not been paying the full amount up to now is also incorrect and makes me very worried about Council's elected members understanding of the existing rates charges, how they have been changed and the financial impact of this for ratepayers.

The Council published FAQ sheet "Proposed changes to how Council rates for drinking and wastewater" also contains incorrect information about the multi-residential factor that currently applies to a property with two residential dwellings – stating the factor is 1.7.

I believe that successive rates reviews have exposed many inequities within Buller District Council's rating system but in the 2024/25 Draft Annual Plan only multi-use and commercial targeted rates have been selected for change – to me this seems to be an inequitable pickand-mix approach.

#### 2. Errors in the Sample Rates Tables in the Consultation Document

The rates policy options presented in the 2024/25 Consultation Document are supported by tables outlining the impact of the proposed changes. I have reviewed the Westport and Reefton examples where two SUIP exist on a multi-residential property and the proposed increase from a factor of 1.0 to 2.0 applies.

The table "Rating examples For Two Separately Used or Inhabited Portions Under Proposed Changed Policy" does not use a 2024/25 multi-residential general rate differential, only applies one target rate for solid waste collection and miscalculates the percentage increase from 2023/24. As a result, the rates examples provided to the community during the consultation period have been inaccurate and misleading.

The Consultation Document Westport example of a \$106,000 land value applies a single residential differential and assumes a prior year target rate factor of 1.7 for water and wastewater rates. The calculation produces a \$528 (14%) increase from 2023/24. Using an applicable multi-residential differential and correcting the prior year target rate factor to 1.0 results in a staggering increase of \$3,233 (65%). The published calculation for the Reefton example with a land value of \$100,000 results in an increase of \$367 (12%) in the Consultation Document table but recalculating the result using general rate differentials and target rate factors in accordance with Council's published Rates Funding Impact Statements produces another significant increase of \$2,638 (71%).

These calculations are detailed in the table on the next page.

I commence this submission by expressing extreme disappointment at the limited subject content of the consultation document for the Enhanced Annual Plan. To focus almost entirely on just two elements disengages a large portion of ratepayers.

To claim repeatedly that roading was identified as the community's number one priority in the pre-engagement only serves to demonstrate how inadequate that engagement and accompanying survey was.

The proposed 19.7% rates increase is assuredly of greater concern for a vast majority of ratepayers. The initial indication of a 31% increase to commence discussions should never have been accepted by councillors. The 4.8% increase contained in the current Long Term Plan should have been the starting point for discussion. It is changes to the content of the LTP that obliges you to consult when developing an Annual Plan.

To accept the age old tactic of nominating a ridiculous, unattainable figure to begin negotiating from was shameful. Too often it is easy to have a perception of elected representatives acting as agents for management when the very reverse of that is their governance role. In this case, you earn no plaudits for achieving a reduction from 31% to 19.7% rates increase.

#### ISSUE ONE, FUNDING OF ROADS.

The 3 options presented for road funding, central to the consultation document are each based on hypothetical situations. Option 1 provides a possible opportunity for a reduction in the proposed general rate. Option 2 offers a choice of seeking a larger than 19.7% increase in our rates, and option 3 if chosen indicates to the New Zealand Transport Agency that we can operate with less than their 75% subsidy. That Agency cannot be expected to be overly generous in considering Councils application for funding with such a dark cloud hanging over the efficacy of previous spending by the Project Management Office and Councils refusal to make public the findings of the financial audit enquiry into that spending.

Given that no details of the work programme submitted for funding are contained in the Draft Annual Plan it is not possible to make an informed decision on a preferred option.

### CONSULTATION ISSUE 2. WATER RATES.

#### Option 1.

I question the need and reasons advanced for the proposed revised policy on how water and waste water targetted rates are charged. Council generally provides a single connection to each rateable property and the present arrangement appears to place no pressure on the capacity of either system to cope. The number of people living at a property determines the demand on water and waste water services and there would be many instances whereby there are more people resident in a single household than in two separate habitable units on one rateable property.

A Any concern about capacity negates the case for proposing to charge unconnected properties for availability of supply. In doing so you possibly persuade them to seek connection. It also fails to acknowledge the expense and effort of people maintaining their own supply at no cost to Council.

It is somewhat ironic that you would create that situation at a time when a number of the districts small communities may be required to revert to individual supplies as Council services become increasingly unaffordable.

One of the reasons given for proposing the change is to align the policy more closely with the methods of charging set out in the Local Government (Rating) Act 2002. The present policy meets all requirements within that Act.

#### EMPLOYEE BENEFIT EXPENSES.

As far as I can determine the proposed Annual Plan seeks to increase employee benefits by \$800,000 compared to the previous years Plan.

Office based employees current annual salary, wages and benefits equate to more than \$1,000 per rateable property.

It is worth noting that at Councils most recent meeting (April 24th) councillors spent about 90 minutes deciding the allocation of #\$45,000 to community organisations and required more than 350 pages of details supporting their funding applications from largely volunteer groups.

It is hoped that councillors apply a similar detailed level of critical scrutiny to managements claim for \$800,000 additional funding. May I suggest that a complete list of management and staff names, job titles and position descriptions would be a good start.

There appears to be an attempt to mitigate the impact on ratepayers of this claim by stating that funding would not only come direct from ratepayers but from fees and charges and recovery from capital projects. I would remind every-one involved that money from all sources is our (ratepayers) money and it is our elected representatives who decide how it is spent.

#### **RATING RELATIVITIES**

I note in the Funding Impact Statement (page 123) relating to General Differential Land Rates a significant shift in differentials relative to each other in respect of the two largest categories, namely Residential 106 being the vast majority of Westport township(#2000 properties) and Rural 141 being properties greater than 10 hectares (#660 in number).

In the 10yrs leading up to the 2022 revaluation category 141 averaged a factor of 0.22942 relative to a factor of 1.00000 in respect of category 106.

In the two applications since the recent revaluation that relativity now reads 0.40647 relative to a factor of 1.00000 for category 106. It is worth noting that the 2021 Rates Review proposed establishing a 0.25000 factor for the 141 category. An explanation for this shift is needed.

I alluded earlier in this submission to a survey carried out in the pre-engagement exercise. That Survey was conducted by Public Voice Ltd. (Wellington) at a cost of \$26,000 plus GST and attracted 332 responses. Although Council somewhat selectively chose roading as the most indicated priority, affordability was a dominating theme throughout the ensuing report. There is little to be seen in this proposed Annual Plan to address those affordability concerns.

#### CHARLESTON INFRASTRUCTURE

I am writing on behalf of the Charleston Waitakere Community Group (CWCG) that among other things provides a forum and voice for the Charleston community.

Charleston with its amazing gold rush heritage and spectacular scenery is a significant village within the Buller District. Over the last twenty years the population of the village and environs has shown considerable growth yet there are no community facilities provided by Council. Since the inception of the Buller District Council in 1989, Charleston appears to have been overlooked with respect to the provision of community facilities.

In 2019 Council was involved in a land sale process for abandoned land at Charleston. The sale of these sections has encouraged new people to invest in the village and resulted in an increase in the rates from Charleston.

Situated on the Great Coast Road, Charleston already has significant tourist attractions, including the renowned Underworld Adventures, and within the next 12 months will become the southern terminus of the Kawatiri Coastal Trail. In 2021 the Charleston Tavern re-opened confirming there is confidence in the future of Charleston. A section of abandoned land in the village was purchased by the Charleston Goldfields Club and plans for a heritage garden with a large historic display on this land are being developed.

The opening of the new \$40m Dolomite Point visitor centre at Punakaiki will undoubtedly see more tourists on the Great Coast Road and many of these will stop at Charleston.

With an increasing population and a forecast large increase in visitors that will provide considerable economic benefits to the Buller District, the provision of some community facilities at Charleston is strongly justified.

It is noted in the BDC Draft Annual Plan page 56, Community Facilities:

"Why are we involved in these activities

- The provision and maintenance of amenities and reserves creotes o pleosant environment in which to live, work and play, which is an important part of the vision for the district. Amenities and reserve areas provide for social interaction and promote sport and recreation.
- The provision of public tailet facilities assists with promoting the health and well-being of the community and environment as well as enhancing the visitar experienc

CWCG is keen to see the following priorities implemented before the forecasted influx in visitor numbers impacts the Charleston infrastructure:

- 1. Construct a footpath along Princes Street from SH 6 to Constant Bay
- 2. Provide public toilets within Charleston village.
- 3. Investigate options for new parking facilities.
- 4. Reduce the speed limit along Princes Street to 30 km/hr.
- 5. Reduce the speed limit along Beach Road from SH6 to Hands Road to 30 km/hr
