## Draft Dangerous, Affected, and Insanitary Buildings Policy Review

### Council is gathering feedback from the community on the Draft Dangerous, Affected, and Insanitary Buildings Policy.

The intent of the Dangerous, Affected and Insanitary Buildings Policy is to reduce the risk of injury, death, ill health or damage that may occur as a result of dangerous, affected, and/or insanitary buildings.

Council has reviewed the current Policy and is proposing some changes to bring the Policy up to date and to make it clear how Council identifies, assesses and manages these buildings.

The Statement of Proposal summarises the proposed key changes in the Draft Policy and the two options out for public consideration. These are to either adopt the Draft Policy or to retain the current Policy.

The Statement of Proposal, Draft Policy, current Policy, and submission forms are available at Council's offices, libraries, the Ngakawau Community Centre, the Karamea Information Centre or on Council's community engagement hub Let's talk Buller.

The outcome of this consultation will guide Council in keeping our community safe from dangerous, affected, and insanitary buildings.

## All dogs in Buller need to be registered

If you own and have registered your dog, you should receive your dog registration form at the end of June.

Once you have received your form, you can call into Council offices in Westport or Reefton to pay and pick up your red tag.

### Prices this year are:

**Desexed - \$69.50 | Entire - \$89.50**

If you use your dog principally for herding or droving stock your dog is eligible for our working dog rate.

**Desexed - \$52.50 | Entire - \$67.50**

Dogs that support a person with a disability or medical condition may not be subject to registration fees, at the discretion of the Compliance Manager.

If your dog is not registered with us you will not receive a form. Dogs can be registered at Council Offices during normal office hours: Westport 8.30 am - 4.30 pm and Reefton 9.00 am to 4.30 pm Monday to Friday. If your details, or your dog's details have changed, don't forget to update them when you pay your dog registration fee.

# Buller's popular polystyrene recycling programme to expand



**Mitre 10, EXPOL, Smart Environmental and Buller District Council's free polystyrene recycling initiative has grown to include two new collection points, located at the Westport and Reefton Transfer Stations from 9 June 2025.**

The project, which began in September 2023, now enables all Buller residents to recycle their polystyrene for free, meaning people no longer have to pay to dispose of bulky polystyrene as refuse, and preventing it from going to landfill.

A collection cube is available in Mitre 10's trade drive-through, and the programme has now been extended to include additional collection cubes located at the Westport Transfer Station and Reefton Transfer Station and managed by operator Smart Environmental.

Buller residents who want to recycle their polystyrene are reminded they can drop off up to 240 litres of polystyrene at a time (a standard wheelie bin full). It must be free of dirt, food waste or residue, stickers and tape. Please note, this is a domestic waste recycling initiative, commercial waste cannot be accepted.

Buller District Council funds the transportation costs for sending the collected polystyrene from Westport to Christchurch for recycling, using Waste Minimisation Funds received from the Ministry for the Environment's Waste Levy Fund, meaning there is no cost to ratepayers.

Mitre 10 will continue to coordinate the programme and store the returned polystyrene prior to it being transported to Canterbury for reprocessing.

The polystyrene waste is recycled in Christchurch by EXPOL and is used in a variety of products such as EXPOL Timber UnderFloor Insulation, EXPOL Earth Green Beans Bean Bag Fill and EXPOL Tuff PODs.



# NZ Creative Communities Scheme Funding round 1 of 3 open now

## Funding from the Creative Communities Scheme is available for community-based arts activities in the Buller District.

The Scheme aims to increase participation in the arts at a local level and increase the range and diversity of arts available to communities.

The Scheme is a partnership between Creative New Zealand and local authorities. Each local authority is responsible for delivering the Scheme in its area.

Local decision-making is the key to the Scheme, and applications are considered by a subcommittee, which consists of two Councillors, one representative from the local Iwi, one representative from each of the three Community Arts Councils (Karamea, Buller, and Inangahua), and two community members.

There are three funding rounds for each financial year (1 July–30 June).

Please note that groups or organisations must provide a copy of their latest financial statement.
